All are welcome to follow the Parade and to join in the Service at the church.




An alternative Act of Remembrance

At only £1 per session, the comfortable and warm surroundings has been referred-to as 'the best place to meet', and is ideal for those who may not be involved with any of the churches




Saving Lives in Wotton



	Location	Description
	Location	Description
1	Bowls Club, Dryleaze	On the Club House facing the Court
2	Civic Centre	By the main entrance, facing the car park
3	The Royal Oak, Haw St	To the right of the main entrance door in Haw St
4	Old Crown Hse, Market St	On the side wall between Old Crown House and the Town Hall
5	The Keepers (Old Symn Lane Clinic)	Adjacent to the main entrance door.
6	Chipping Manor Dental Practice, Long St	Adjacent to the main entrance door
7	Culverhay Surgery	On the front wall of the surgery, facing the car park.
8	J C Household, Dyers Brook	On the front wall, between the entrance to the showroom and the roller-shutter door.
9	Synwell Sports & Social Club	Facing the playing field
10	Oliver Memorial Chapel	On the front wall, to the left of the entrance door.
11	Newsmarket, Wortley Road	On the side wall of the shop, to the right of the entrance door.

In 2014 the Bible Society produced an anthology of Psalms, poems, stories, hymns & paintings called *Hear My Cry - words for when there are no words*. The book includes the below.

Christ in Flanders

We had forgotten You, or very nearly — You did not seem to touch us very nearly— Of course we thought about You now and then; Especially in any time of trouble — We knew that You were good in time of trouble-But we are very ordinary men.

And there were always other things to think of — There's lots of things a man has got to think of— His work, his home, his pleasure, and his wife; And so we only thought of You on Sunday — Sometimes, perhaps, not even on a Sunday — Because there's always lots to fill one's life.

And, all the while, in street or lane or byway — In country lane, in city street, or byway — You walked among us, and we did not see. Your feet were bleeding as You walked our pavements — How did we miss Your footprints on our pavements? — Can there be other folk as blind as we?

Now we remember; over here in Flanders — (It isn't strange to think of You in Flanders) — This hideous warfare seems to make things clear. We never thought about You much in England — But now that we are far away from England, We have no doubts, we know that You are here.

You helped us pass the jest along the trenches — Where, in cold blood, we waited in the trenches — You touched its ribaldry and made it fine. You stood beside us in our pain and weakness — We're glad to think You understand our weakness — Somehow it seems to help us not to whine.

We think about You kneeling in the Garden — Ah! God! the agony of that dread Garden — We know You prayed for us upon the cross. If anything could make us glad to bear it — 'Twould be the knowledge that You willed to bear it — Pain — death — the uttermost of human loss.

Though we forgot You — You will not forget us — We feel so sure that You will not forget us — But stay with us until this dream is past.

And so we ask for courage, strength, and pardon — Especially, I think, we ask for pardon — And that You'll stand beside us to the last.
