Time to Reflect

Read the passage, slowly
Take a moment to think about the passage - is it familiar to you?
Read the passage again. Think about it as you read.
Do you remember what you have learned about this passage?
Put all that to one side for the moment, and pray to God to open
your heart and mind to God's Word here and now.
Read the passage for the third time - but now do so very slowly,
word by slow word, remembering that you are listening for God's
words now, not what you have learned or heard in the past.

What speaks to you in this passage?

Take a time to sit quietly

For a full minute, sit quietly, silently, listening. Listening to your own
heart; listening to your memories, but above all, listening to God.
Finally, read the passage one last time, and say "Amen".
